

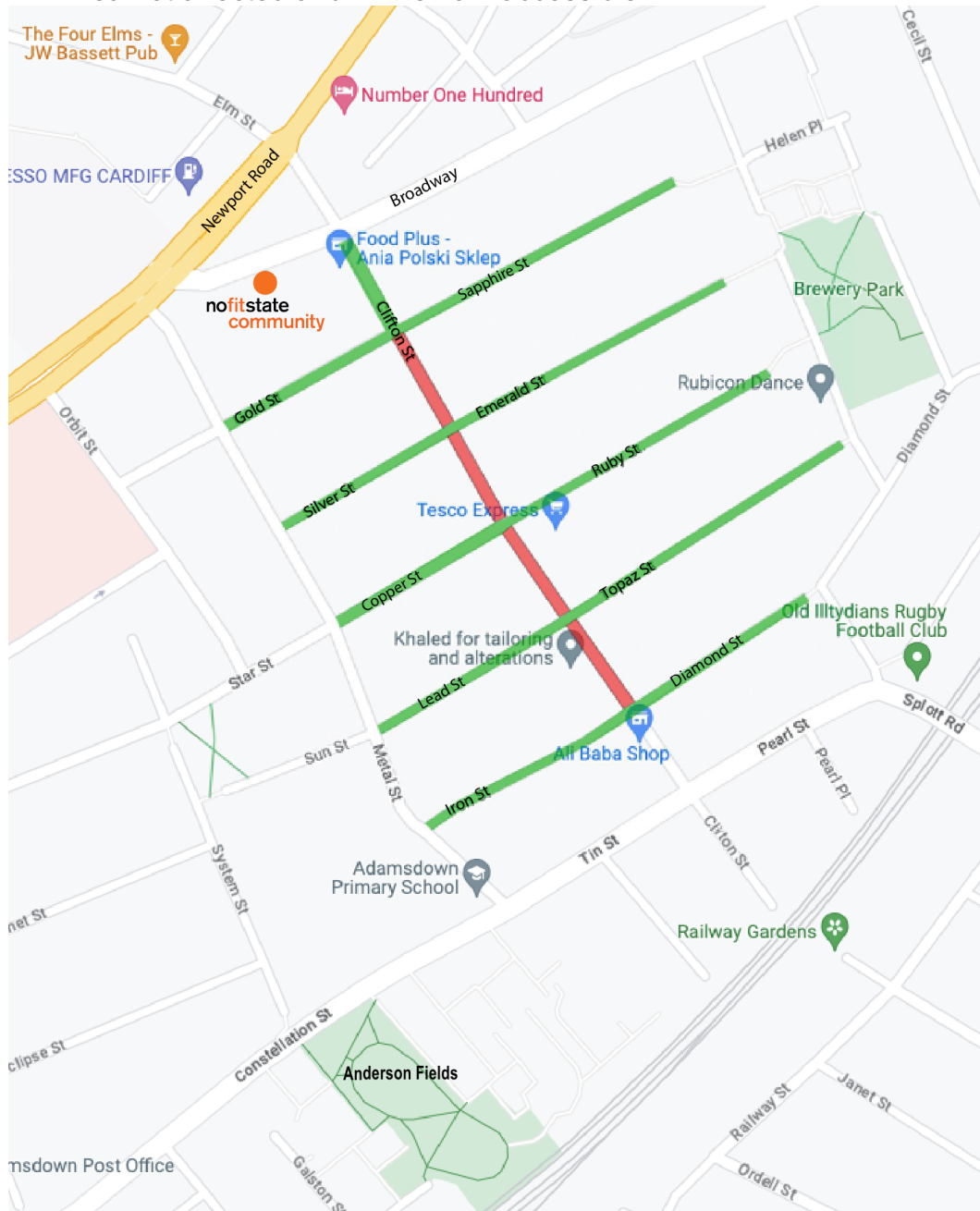
Notification of Road Closure, Saturday 2 September

Following on from the success of last summer's Clifton Street Festival, the 'Square Mile' community partnership invites you to join us for a free outdoor community event – a big picnic – called **Gwledd Parc Feast** on Saturday 2 September in Anderson Fields, 12.30-4.30pm.

There will be a parade along Clifton Street (from Gold Street) to Anderson Fields, leaving at 12pm.

NoFit State have applied to the Council to close sections of Clifton Street on this day to allow people to meet safely from 11.30am for the parade.

The closure will be in effect from **11am until 12.30pm** on **Saturday 2 September**, and will impact the sections of Clifton Street from Gold & Sapphire Streets down to Iron and Diamond Streets. Access to Sapphire Street, Emerald Street, Ruby Street, Topaz Street and Diamond Street will remain possible via the streets opposite throughout the day, with no obstructions to the raised crossroads. Please refer to the map below.

In preparation for the day, will be gradually restricting access to the parking bays along the affected sections of Clifton Street, and we kindly ask you to avoid parking in the bays ahead of the closure. Parking will remain available on all side streets as usual.

Gwledd Parc Feast will be a small-scale event in Anderson Fields with food, live music, performances, and activities to celebrate the diverse communities of **Splott, Adamsdown and Tremorfa** that make up our Square Mile. The event will be inclusive, multi-cultural and family-friendly – it will be free, and everyone is welcome!
